

Southampton boasts the oldest bowling green in the world dating from 1299 and it has a long, rich history and a remarkable archive. Today the Knights of the Green will welcome you to visit the green and clubhouse and find more about the history of bowls in the town. In 1588 Francis Drake was playing bowls when the Armada was spotted sailing up the Channel, in Southampton, that same year, John Gregorie and John Exton (who both served as town mayors) were fined 10s when their game ended in fisticuffs! 




The Queen in Context: Ann Undressed with Elizabeth Lynch, of Wimbledon College of Art and intern at The Tudor Tailor (Research and Construction) Nottingham.

This interactive presentation will introduce participants to Tudor Dress & the style of clothing that would have been worn by Queen Anne Boleyn on a visit to Southampton during her marriage to King Henry VIII. EVENT The Italians in Southampton with Geoff Watts

In the first half of the sixteenth century Southampton was one of the wealthiest towns in England. It owed its wealth and importance to the fact that the great trading cities of Italy chose the port as their entry point to the country. Many colourful Italian merchants made Southampton their home including Cristoforo Colombo - later to become Christopher Columbus, mayor of Southampton. After the talk why not visit the remains of Columbus's house West Hall at the bottom of Bugle Street? Time 1pm lecture lasts 30 mins

EVENT In Sickness & In Health with Mary South

Sickness and death were much closer in the sixteenth century: plague, influenza and sweating sickness. The use of herbs and natural remedies were one defence and houses such as Tudor House would have gardens that provided not only herbs to enhance cooking but were also a practical medicine chest for the inhabitants. The talk will encompass a visit to Tudor House garden. Time 3pm, lasts approx 30 mins.

During your visit you will meet "townsfolk", interpreters dressed in period costume. Little Woodham's living history interpreters involve you and your children in their daily lives. Prepare timber with the sawyers at their camp, or speak with townspeople as they make lace, or card and spin wool, watch the Blacksmith as he beats hot iron into shape.

In the centre of the square there will be impromptu displays of dance, muster drills, mummers, and minstrelsy law & order will be kept by the Town Crier & Beadle of the Beggars. Southampton's current town crier John Melody will be donning the robes of his predecessor Thomas Blackrow.


Bitterne Park School Tudor Sweetmeats

The Titanic Pub, Upper Bugle Street

This pub's Victorian frontage hides a much longer history. This part of town was where all the wealthy Italian merchants lived. The pub overlooks a garden which was once the site of the home of Roger Machado who was a herald in the court of King Henry VII.



The Dolphin Inn, High Street, Southampton

The Georgian bow windows and links with Jane Austen, hide the inn's Tudor past. In the sixteenth century it was the largest inn in the town and Edward Wilmot would welcome guests from home and abroad to spend the night in one of his many rooms all individually named, such as the Dragon chamber, the Kendalman and the Lion.
